

2025 Economic Analysis Report: An Overview



Introduction

Each year, the Labor Market Information Division of the Department of Employment and Workforce produces an Economic Analysis Report, which outlines key statistics related to South Carolina's labor market and economy. In this month's edition of Trends, we provide an overview of the top takeaways from this year's report.

Labor Force Statistics

Every day across South Carolina, skilled workers—from healthcare practitioners to teachers to construction workers—keep our state functioning and its economy growing. South Carolina's labor force, comprising those who are working or looking for work, has grown rapidly in recent years, adding 216,100 people between 2020 and 2024. Total employment has steadily risen since plummeting in April of 2020 following the COVID-19 pandemic. Employment reached a high of 2,448,500 in April of 2025, but unemployment has also risen in the last four years, from 64,700 in January of 2020 to 106,500 in April of 2025, as shown in Figure 1. Altogether, this suggests that more South Carolinians than ever are seeking (and finding) employment, but there is still an opportunity to continue connecting job seekers with job openings.




Another key labor force statistic is the labor force participation rate (LFPR), which is calculated by dividing the labor force by the civilian noninstitutional population, essentially measuring the percentage of the population that is working or seeking work.

In 2024, LFPR was 58.6 percent, up 0.7 points from the year before. At 81.1 percent, LFPR was highest among the 25-54 age group, also known as the prime-age labor force, as individuals within this age group are the least likely to be in school or retired and are most likely

to be working. Individuals aged 16 to 24 years old had a LFPR of 55.3 percent, and LFPR was 34.3 percent for people aged 55 or older. Labor force participation was higher among men than women—64.2 percent compared to 53.6 percent, respectively.

Better employment outcomes were also correlated with higher levels of educational attainment. Individuals with a bachelor's degree or higher had the highest LFPR at 66.0 percent. People with less than a high school diploma, in comparison, had a LFPR of just 40.5 percent. See Figure 2 for a breakdown of labor force participation across demographic groups.



People who had completed at least some college also had the lowest unemployment rate at 2.8 percent. People who had a high school degree but did not attend college had an unemployment rate of 3.6 percent. For individuals without a high school diploma (or its equivalent), the unemployment rate was 8.2 percent.

It is therefore promising that South Carolina's population is becoming more educated. In 2023 (the most recent year available), 90.2 percent of the population aged 25 and older had graduated high school, up from 88.3 percent in 2019. 32.9 percent of the same population had at least a bachelor's degree in 2023, the highest percentage of the last five years.


Labor market outcomes vary immensely based on a person's background and experience, which is important to remember when evaluating causes of unemployment and strategies for increasing labor force participation. Additionally, as technology evolves, demographics shift, and new businesses come to the state, the types of skills needed for success in the labor market will change, too. With this in mind, let's take a look at the top industries and occupations in South Carolina and identify the state's most in-demand jobs, skills, and certifications.

Industry and Occupation Breakdown

South Carolina's private industries brought in \$303 billion to the state's economy in 2024, up 6.9 percent from 2023 (in current dollars). The largest supersector by GDP was Finance, Insurance, Real Estate, Rental, and Leasing at \$71 billion, followed by Manufacturing at \$47 billion, and Professional and Business Services at \$39 billion.

The top sectors by employment were Healthcare and Social Assistance, employing 316,680 people; Retail Trade, which employed 268,383 people, and Manufacturing, which employed 263,824 people. All but five sectors recorded employment growth over the year. Employment grew fastest in Construction (5.0%); Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas extraction (5.0%); and Other Services (Except Public Administration) (4.9%).

Across all occupation groups, employment was highest in Office and Administrative Support Occupations (283,500), Sales and Related Occupations (234,440), and Food Preparation and Serving Related (225,620), as shown in Figure 3 below.



Many of the most in-demand jobs in 2024 fell into these groups. Jobs related to healthcare and manufacturing were also high on the list. With 23,683 active job ads in 2024, Registered Nurses had the highest demand. First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers came second with 21,173 active job ads, followed by Retail Salespersons with 20,157 active job ads.

With such a large number of people working in customer facing occupations such as retail sales and food service, it is unsurprising that South Carolina had a surplus of individuals with skills such as hospitality, food service, and point of sale (POS) systems. Technical skills such as Microsoft Office, Microsoft Word, Salesforce, and Lean Six Sigma also had supply surpluses. The largest skill gaps were in mathematics, the ability to lift 51-100 pounds, manufacturing, and English.

Supply gaps in certifications point to a need for skilled medical workers. The three largest certification deficits were for Certified Nursing Assistants, Licensed Practical Nurses, and Certifications in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation. Emergency Medical Technicians also had a supply deficit. Some medical certifications, however, had supply surpluses, such as Basic Life Support, First Aid Certifications, and AED Essentials.

Other certifications with supply deficits include driver's licenses and Class A Commercial Driver's Licenses, Forklift Certifications, and Transportation Worker Identification Credentials. See Figure 4 for the ten largest deficits and surpluses across all occupations. Overall, these data provide vital insights into how the state can continue to improve and meet the needs of its workforce.


SOUTH CAROLINA'S EMPLOYMENT SITUATION (AUGUST 2025)

Household Survey¹ (Local Area Unemployment Statistics)

Nationally, there is a monthly Current Population Survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) to determine employment status of the civilian population. This information, along with other inputs, are used by DEW to operate the Local Area Unemployment Statistics program, which estimates the number of individuals employed and those not employed, but actively seeking employment statewide and for a variety of substate geographies.

EMPLOYMENT (SEASONALLY ADJUSTED³):

- The seasonally adjusted number of South Carolina workers increased to 2,464,843.
- That is an increase of 545 people over the July 2025 estimate.
- That is an increase of 31,045 people over the August 2024 estimate.




SOUTH CAROLINA'S EMPLOYMENT SITUATION (CONT.)

UNEMPLOYMENT (SEASONALLY ADJUSTED3):

- The estimate of unemployed people increased to 110,750.
- That is an increase of 3,003 people from the July estimate and a decrease of 5,826 from the August 2024 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased to 4.3 percent. The national unemployment rate increased to 4.3 percent, according to the Current Population survey.

LABOR FORCE:

- The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,575,593 while the labor force participation rate increased to 57.6 percent.
- That is an increase of 3,548 people over the July 2025 estimate.
- That is an increase of 25,219 individuals over the August 2024 estimate.



SOUTH CAROLINA'S EMPLOYMENT SITUATION (CONT.)

Employer Survey² (Current Employment Statistics)

BLS conducts a monthly Current Employment Statistics survey of approximately 119,000 businesses and government agencies which yields national estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry. These data are processed by DEW to generate comparable data for the state and its metropolitan statistical areas (MSA).







MONTHLY UNEMPLOYMENT SINCE JANUARY 2020




MONTHLY UNEMPLOYMENT RATE SINCE JANUARY 2020



MONTHLY LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE SINCE JANUARY 2020




MONTHLY EMPLOYMENT SINCE JANUARY 2020



TECHNICAL NOTES:

- 1. Household Survey: Nationally, there is a monthly Current Population Survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) to determine employment status of the civilian population. This information, along with other inputs, is used by DEW to operate the Local Area Unemployment Statistics program, which estimates the number of individuals employed and those not employed, but actively seeking employment for statewide and a variety of sub-state geographies.
- 2. Employer Survey: BLS conducts a monthly Current Employment Statistics survey of about 44,000 employers which yields national estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry. This data is processed by DEW to generate comparable data for the state and its metropolitan statistical areas.
- 3. Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.
- **4. Not Seasonally Adjusted:** Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have not been removed from this data.
