

DEMOGRAPHIC AND ECONOMIC TRENDS IN THE CAROLINAS

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POPULATION BY STATE

- The Carolinas are growing far faster than the national population, according to the most recent U.S. Census Bureau estimates.
 - These reflect changes between July 1, 2020, and July 1, 2021.
- South Carolina was the fastest growing state east of the Rockies.
 However, both states had more deaths than births in that time.



POPULATION BY COUNTY

- Counties in green gained people in the 12 months ending 7/1/2021, while those in purple lost people.
- In both states, the Interstate 95 corridor continues to experience substantial distress.
- 20 of 46 SC counties lost people; pre-covid, most counties did so.







POPULATION PROJECTIONS BY STATE

- Population projections are generated by the U.S. Census Bureau in conjunction with state-level partners:
 - NC Office of State Budget and Management (<u>https://osbm.nc.gov</u>)
 - SC Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office (<u>https://rfa.sc.gov</u>)
- North Carolina is expected to have 12.1 million residents by 2035, an increase of 15.7 percent from 2020 levels.
- South Carolina is expected to have 5.8 million residents by 2035, an increase of 13.6 percent from 2020 levels.

LOCAL AREA UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS BY STATE


- Economic data are compiled monthly by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in conjunction with state-level partners:
 - Labor and Economic Analysis Division, NC Dept of Commerce
 - Labor Market Information Division, SC Dept of Employment & Workforce
- Data below are preliminary and seasonally adjusted for last month. The national unemployment rate was 3.5% for September 2022.

CURRENT EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS BY STATE

▶ While LAUS data measure people, CES data measure jobs.

CES is a survey of firms that pay unemployment insurance taxes, and therefore does not include contractors, sole proprietors, etc.

 Both states are growing faster than the 3.9% national growth rate. (Data are preliminary and seasonally adjusted.)

LONG-TERM EMPLOYMENT PROJECTIONS

- The Employment and Training Administration at USDOL provides Workforce Information Grants to states for LMI dissemination.
- Part of that work is the development of employment projections, most notably ten-year estimates produced last summer.

Both states are expected to exceed US growth of 7.7 percent.

- JOLTS is a BLS product that is newly providing state-level data.
- The table below (data are preliminary, as of August) indicates that both states have more active labor markets than average:
