Who do we help?


Everyone. Employers are one of our most crucial audiences, but we also serve jobseekers, policymakers, educators, and anyone with a stake in our state's prosperity.

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Upstate Region: Fast Facts



1,643,433 - Population (2022)

Population grew by 88,312 over the last five years and is projected to grow by 76,045 over the next 5 years.



757,336 – Total Regional Employment

Jobs grew by 43,603 over the last five years and are projected to grow by 43,474 over the next five years.



\$63.1K – Average Earnings Per Job (2022)


Regional average earning per job are \$17.7K below the national average earnings of \$80.8K per job.





Top Industry Employment Concentration






Upstate Region: Location Quotients

- This bar chart shows the relative concentration of employment by economic sector.
- The Upstate has 2.17x the number of manufacturing workers relative to the national per capita average.
- This is by far the highest figure for any sector and region in the state.

Upstate Region: Postings by Occupation

- Meanwhile, this bar chart shows the distribution of job postings by occupational group.
- As in every region, the "Healthcare Practitioners and Technical" group has the most postings.
- This is driven foremost by demand for registered nurses, not assistants.

1,476,306 - Population (2022)

Population grew by 43,739 over the last five years and is projected to grow by 22,596 over the next 5 years.



680,239 - Total Regional Employment

Jobs grew by 23,136 over the last five years and are projected to grow by 36,571 over the next five years.



\$65.5K – Average Earnings Per Job (2022)

Regional average earning per job are \$15.3K below the national average earnings of \$80.8K per job.

Central Region: Postings by Company

- Thanks to Lightcast, we have access to detailed, granular data on who is hiring in South Carolina, both today and over time historically.
- This chart shows the dominance of Columbia's historic economic base ("eds and meds" and state workers) in hiring activity.

Central Region: Employees and Employers

Four of the five largest job centers by ZIP code are in or near Columbia while three of the five largest concentrations of workers are not.

This suggests large-scale commuting outflows into North Carolina.

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Pee Dee Region: Fast

Facts



1,005,618 - Population (2022)

Population grew by 16,075 over the last five years and is projected to grow by 759 over the next 5 years.



411,968 - Total Regional Employment

Jobs grew by 18,024 over the last five years and are projected to grow by 28,353 over the next five years.



\$55.1K – Average Earnings Per Job (2022)

Regional average earning per job are \$25.7K below the national average earnings of \$80.8K per job.






Educational Attainment

Concerning educational attainment, 14.0% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree (6.8% below the national average), and 10.1% hold an Associate's Degree (1.3% above the national average).



Pee Dee Region: Educational Attainment



Central Region: Underemployment

The Pee Dee has a chicken-and-egg problem. Educational attainment is low relative to national and state averages, which depresses wages, but residents are largely overqualified for the jobs available.

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

Population grew by 49,907 over the last five years and is projected to grow by 28,348 over the next 5 years.



531,663 – Total Regional Employment

Jobs grew by 37,534 over the last five years and are projected to grow by 38,636 over the next five years.



\$69.0K – Average Earnings Per Job (2022)


Regional average earning per job are \$11.9K below the national average earnings of \$80.8K per job.





The table below analyzes past and current residents of South Coast WIOA. The left column shows residents of other counties migrating to South Coast WIOA. The right column shows residents migrating from South Coast WIOA to other counties.


In 2020, 1,101 people have migrated from Richland County, SC to South Coast WIOA. In the same year, 1,008 people left South Coast WIOA migrating to Richland County, SC. The total Net Migration for South Coast WIOA in 2020 was 9,644.



South Coast Region: Migrations Patterns

- Contrary to popular commentary, not everyone moving to the coast is from the Buckeye State.
- The largest sources of individuals moving in and out of the region are South Carolina and adjacent states.
- Migration to/from San Diego is likely related to military activity.
